Raising Awareness about Life Insurance



Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. The Pilgrim Icon was on display on the altar of Santa Maria del Mar

Church for one week. The Litany of St. Joseph was prayed by Knights of Columbus members at Santa Maria del Mar Church after a special Mass Thursday evening Mass. The prayer service, flowing from the Year of St. Joseph declared by Pope Francis in 2021, and inspired by his apostolic letter *Patris Corde*, was sponsored by Knights of Columbus Notre Dame Council 10514 as well as Corpus Christi Assembly 2810 to honor St. Joseph and pray for his intercession in

preserving, cultivating and passing on the Catholic faith to future generations.

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly chose to entrust his service as Supreme Knight to St. Joseph and through this Pilgrim Icon Program, encourage Knights and their communities to "turn in prayer to St. Joseph, give thanks to God for the gift of fatherly example, and ask St. Joseph to be a father to us" as we seek to "grow in our own imitation of St. Joseph's quiet strength, integrity and fidelity."

'FOLLOWERSHIP'

Notre Dame Council 10514 July Meeting Remarks



As we begin the new fraternal year there's no doubt that we have elected a great leadership team. And although there are many years of Knight's related experience with these leaders, they still need our help and support as followers to make this year even better than the last.

When we talk about leaders and leadership, we also need to include followers and 'followership'. 'Followership' is important for many reasons, primarily without followers there are no leaders. For any organization to succeed, there must be people who are willing to follow effectively, just as there must be those who are willing to lead effectively.

While 'followership' may not sound as glamorous as leadership, there is absolutely nothing wrong with being a follower. In fact, having the qualities of a good follower are equally important to the success of any organization, as do the qualities of a good leader.

Followers are diligent, motivated, pay attention to detail and are committed. With the Knights of Columbus, that commitment includes the principles of our Order; charity, unity and fraternity.

Effective followers don't just get things done, -- they keep leaders on their toes, help bring out their very best, and hold them accountable. Effective followers are also critical thinkers, but with a positive attitude. When they identify problems, they also identify and recommend solutions. When followers form a positive relationship with their leader, they are in a better position to potentially influence situations where they perceive the leader to be making a mistake.

When good leadership meets good 'followership' good things happen. Within our own organization, one good example is the strong history we have of supporting pro-life pregnancy centers across the nation. Leadership started when the Supreme Council implemented the Ultrasound Initiative Program. 'Followership' is the successful raising of funds by local councils to purchase ultrasound machines and placing them in faith based pregnancy centers. The Florida jurisdiction has helped purchase over one hundred ultrasound machines. Our council, in particular, has assisted in the purchase of five ultrasound machines since 2017.

From 2018 to 2021, we have more than 1.7 million volunteer hours. Over this same period of time, the Knights donated more than \$18 million in funds and supplies to pro-life pregnancy centers and maternity homes.

In a recent press release, our Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly said, "As Knights, we are called to courage and self-sacrifice. Standing for life means making personal sacrifices for women and children in need — being willing to give of our time, skills and financial resources, and accepting the fact that the fruits of our labors are often hidden."

In this same vein, on June 26th, the Pope in his Angelus address said, "... Jesus helps us to be people who are serene, who are happy with the good accomplished, and who do not seek human approval."

We need to know that what we accomplish at the council level has positive, far-reaching effects and it all starts here. Our support of LIFE is just one example of the impact our Faith in Action Programs have on our church and community.

We need to be aware, that even with the recent Supreme Court decision, old challenges will continue and we **WILL** be faced with new obstacles.

This is why, most importantly we need to know that our council, our church parish and our community need us more than ever.

All this to say, we need you to step-up and volunteer. I'm sure the officers and directors can use all the help they can get.

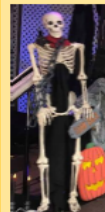
